Colonel Jon Brierton enlisted in the United States Army Reserve in 1989 as an 88N, Movement Specialist. He completed Basic Combat Training at FT Dix, New Jersey in the summer of 1990. He received his commission through California University of Pennsylvania Army ROTC as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army Reserve, Corps of Engineers. Over his career, COL Brierton has served in a variety of leadership and staff positions including platoon leader, Operations Officer, Plans Officers, Company and Battalion Commander, Headquarters

Department of the Army, Office of the Chief of Engineers Reserve Integration & Operations Branch Chief, Office of the Chief Army Reserve, Installations Management Directorate Executive Officer and Strategic Planner, and HQ USACE Chief of Staff for Reserve Affairs. He now serves as the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Deputy Commander- Army and Commander, Army Support Activity- Fort Dix.
