On March 7–9, SSgt Rodriguez visited the Fond Du Lac Tribal Community College, along with 7 AF/CC, Lt Gen Pleus, as part of the General Officer (G.O.) Inspire Program. SSgt Rodriguez, an Aerospace Propulsion Craftsman assigned to MacDill AFB, spoke about her Air Force career and her experience as an Indigenous member in the aviation field. She also assisted recruiters with outreach initiatives for local communities.

SSgt Rodriguez and SSgt James shared their personal stories with MacDill AFB during an interview in early January. Both members of the Navajo Nation provided updates for what the future of Indigenous members in the Air Force hold, including policy initiatives for hair length for men and permissive TDY for cultural ceremonies.
